Of course, we deeply appreciate the efforts of anonymous reviewers that provide valuable feedback on colleagues' work and we thank the board members for their contributions.

Briefly, in the present Volume Dr. Menon and colleagues explore the usage of alcohol and tobacco among University of Zambia students and factors contributing to this behavior. Dr. Karthikeyan and colleagues point out the anti-inflammatory activity of flowers *Hymenocallis littoralis*. Dr. Halder and Dr. Mandal describe the antibacterial activity of commercially available probiotic lactobacilli and the curd lactobacilli. Dr. Ifeanyichukwu and colleagues show an increase in prothrombin time and activated partial thromboplastin time in HIV disease. Dr. Ghagane and colleagues report their

Many other issues are present, as lung cancer metastases, post-transplant lymphoproliferative disorders, diabetes mellitus complications on sexuality, proteomics in urological diagnosis, a case of cystic duct opening into right hepatic duct, the ischemia reperfusion in kidney transplantation, Sickle Cell Anaemia, pharmacogenetics, neural computations, Kruppel-Like Factor 14 in metabolic diseases, circulating mitochondrial DNA, digestive fistulas, proinflammatory cytokines in cardiopulmonary bypass, pediatric dermatology, personalized nanomedicine, properties of Cadmium oxide (CdO) nanoparticles-DNA/RNA complexes.

We hope that readers find this Volume precious and that other Authors will consider submitting their work.
